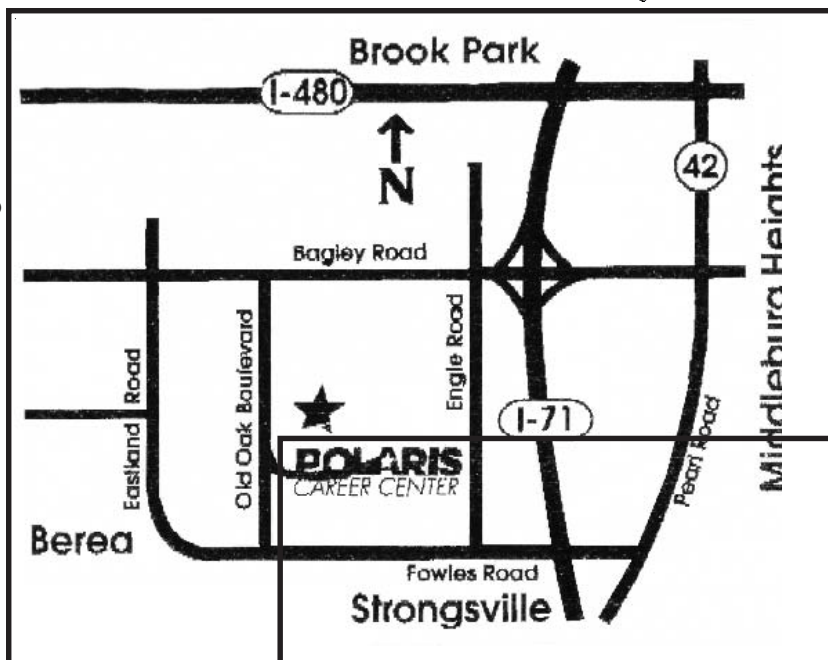
*Please come 15 minutes early.*

It will be a very important seminar and a lot of fun. All members are asked to invite a guest to this seminar.

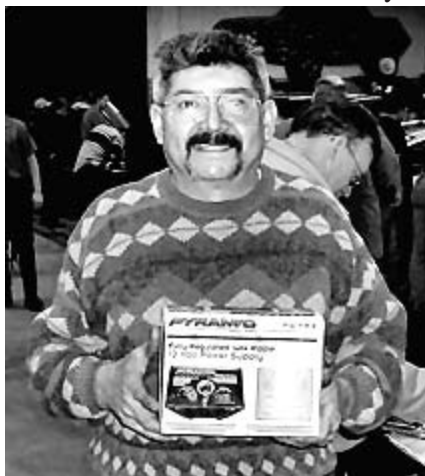


### Upcoming Meetings:
